 Soil noticeably softer at south end. Medieval (it seems) glazed pottery found. Denser assemblage of tiles and stone against south extremities, more ceramic about 1m from about 30cm from the well up to exc. lim. Considerable glaze tile + stone concentration over context, decided it was just preserved by the wall. Decision validated when concentration was excavated

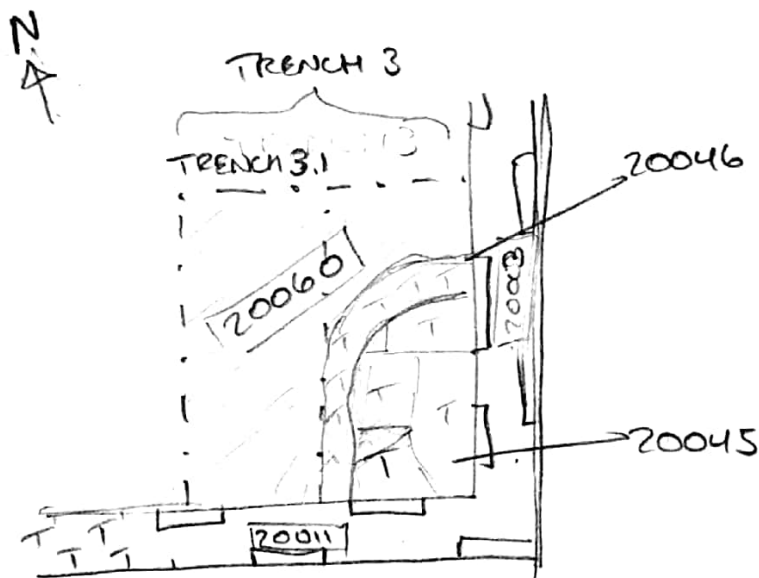
